THE MILITARY CHRISTMAS TREE - 2025



Earlier this year a Serbian spruce (Picea Omorika), which has the look of a Christmas tree, was planted adjacent to the War Memorial in Gheluvelt Park.

From this has come the idea of illuminating the tree at Christmas to recognise past and current service in the forces. Names of those whose service is being recognised will be on The Roll of Recognition which is published online (www.rotaryworcester.org) and will stay there until next year's campaign. The names are also on display in the windows of the Sons of Rest Pavilion in the Park.

For a name to be recognised and included on the Roll of Recognition a minimum donation of $\mathfrak{L}5.00$ is required. Proceeds from the donations will be shared amongst local organisations supporting ex-military personnel and their families.

The tree will be illuminated in the run up to Christmas and though to 6th January 2026.

Names can be anyone <u>living or not</u> and include Army, Navy, RAF, ARP, TA, Land Army, etc SERVICE CAN BE CURRENT OR PAST
